



Daring the Nude

Books are increasingly tackling the "gender" stereotypes in art history, emphasizing the "male gaze" in the depiction of women. In contrast, the "female gaze" theory, which emerged in the mid-1970s with feminist art history, remains underexplored, especially regarding how female artists portray the nude.

Historically, women lacked access to nude classes and were hesitant to participate. But perhaps the real issue is our collective inability to see the nude through women's eyes.

This work aims to flip the script on art history and open our eyes to the female gaze, spanning four centuries with chronological chapters featuring artists born from 1575 to 1975:

Hildegard von Bingen, Artemisia Gentileschi, Imogen Cunnigham, Paula Modersohn-Becker, Suzanne Valadon, Amrita Sher-Gil, Tarsila do Amaral, Faith Ringgold, Martha Rosler, Cindy Sherman, Louise Bourgeois, Alice Neel are some of the many artists to have represented the naked body in their time.

Camille Morineau is a French exhibition curator, heritage curator and artistic director. For ten years she worked at the Musée National d'Art Moderne in the Centre National d'Art et de Culture Georges-Pompidou in Paris, curating the exhibition elles@centrepompidou. From 2016 to 2019, she was Director of Collections and Exhibitions at the Monnaie de Paris. In November 2020, she was appointed Chair of the Board of Directors of the École du Louvre. She is also the founder of AWARE (Archives of Women Artists, Research and Exhibitions), an organization dedicated to raising the visibility of women artists from the 20th century onward.

An exhaustive reference work on modern art in Scandinavian countries. The term "Scandinavian" here brings together the five Nordic neighbours with their different languages and cultures: Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden. Of their modern art, we only really know a few famous artists and an aesthetic where originality and continuity of tradition are intertwined.

This extensively illustrated history from Impressionism up to the 1950s leaves plenty of room for the discovery of surprising and prodigious artists whose common trait is that unique Nordic light, such as Anders Zorn and Hilma af Klimt, Vilhelm Hammershøi and Franciska Clausen, Edvard Munch and Harriet Backer, Akseli Gallen-Kallela and Fanny Churberg, Finnur Jónsson and Öyvind Fahlström.


In this book, Serge Fauchereau also shows the extent to which women artists have been present for a long time in these countries, where women's rights were defended very early on.

As contemporary as this graphic art form may appear to readers outside of Japan, manga has deep roots in Japanese culture, drawing on centuries-old artistic traditions. Traces can be found in seventh-century temple paintings, folding screens decorated with comic characters, and painted medieval emakimono scrolls. The more familiar manga comics of today echo similar themes, both light-hearted and serious, and draw on narrative forms present in both sagas and skits from Japan's rich cultural heritage.

This volume spans the history of manga in all its splendor and diversity. Among the many highlights included are Hokusai's seminal Hokusai Manga of 1814, the advent of the gekiga style in the 1950s, the landmark Astro Boy by Tezuka Osamu, Lady Oscar, Riyoko Ikeda's shojo manga aimed at young girls, samurai sagas, alternative productions by the review Garo, the demons that populate the works of Mizuki Shigeru, and the latest creations from Jiro Taniguchi. Each period is covered in detail by author Brigitte Koyama-Richard and illustrated with drawings and prints.

One Thousand Years of Manga is both an informative account of the genesis of the form and a visual delight. Featuring more than four hundred illustrations and captivating texts, the book situates manga in its proper context, appreciating it for what it truly is: an integral part of Japanese art and culture that is as rich and revealing as it is popular.



Half a century after Pasolini's death, his legacy still pervades the diverse creative fields in which he worked; he remains a source of inspiration for filmmakers today.

Pier Paolo Pasolini was an intellectual with a painfully lucid view of his time, acutely aware of the rise of consumerist society. Although Pasolini considered himself primarily as a writer, he was best known through his film repertoire. Cinema provided a sounding board for his political ideas, which also played a central role in his written work. Pasolini's pluralistic approach combined poems, novels, essays, political statements, and films to create a cohesive message.


This book, and the exhibition it accompanies, demonstrates how the aesthetics of the writer-director's films were developed and influenced through the prism of classical and contemporary art, with clips from Accattone, Théorème, Salò, and other films juxtaposed alongside paintings by Pontormo, Pieter Claesz, Giorgio Morandi, Fernand Léger, and Francis Bacon. It retraces Pasolini's formative years studying art history at the University of Bologna under the guidance of Roberto Longhi, who held a lasting influence on Pasolini's taste. In his films, Pasolini reappropriated classical paintings in three ways: reproducing them as "living paintings" (The Deposition of Pontormo in La Ricotta); referencing them by reworking their composition or evoking striking details (Caravaggio's Sick Young Bacchus in Accatone); or including them on set (Juan Gris's Nature morte devant une fenêtre ouverte in Salo). To complete the book, works by thirty contemporary artists such as John Waters, Jenny Holzer, William Kentridge, Tom Burr, Marlene Dumas, Cerith Wyn Evans, Ernest Pignon-Ernest, Giovanni Fontana, and more demonstrate Pasolini's lasting influence on the art world.

Guillaume de Sardes is an art historian, writer, essayist, photographer and curator. Editor-in-chief of the magazine *Le Monde de l'art* in the past, he now runs the art magazine *Prussian Blue* and the bilingual online magazine *art-critique.com*. He is also a member of the committee of the Centre de la photographie Genève and responsible for the development of the Nouveau Musée National de Monaco.
