The Garden: Cultivation – Planting



"Do you like flowers?" Louis XVI is said to have asked his young queen. "Well, I have a bouquet for you: the Petit-Trianon." And so, Marie-Antoinette wholeheartedly took over Madame de Pompadour's former property, transforming the gardens into a fairytale landscape.

Using archives and architect Richard Mique's blueprints from 1777, Elisabeth de Feydeau recreates an imaginary herbarium, just like the queen might have done while walking about her property.

The book reads like a promenade, taking the reader from one lovely spot to the next: the French garden with its hyacinth, buttercup, and anemone flowerbeds in front of the chateau; the narrow Judas-tree-lined alleys in the Anglo-Chinese garden; the gazebo with its conifers, the setting of lavish parties by night; the temple of Love and its enchantingly scented shrubs; the Hamlet and its luscious fruit gardens; and finally, the coppice of Solitude and its wildwood flowers.

More than describing a herbarium, Elisabeth de Feydeau invites readers to dive into the eighteenth-century botanical life, complete with newly discovered species, anecdotes from court, and different fragrances' uses in perfumes and cosmetics.

Elisabeth de Feydeau is a fragrance specialist and the author of *Les Parfums* (Robert Laffont, 2011) and *Jean-Louis Fargeon, parfumeur de Marie-Antoinette* (Perrin, 2005). In addition to being an expert for designer perfumeries like Chanel and Guerlain, de Feydeau also teaches at a prestigious perfume school in Versailles.

Catherine Pégard is the president of the Château de Versailles and the estate's museum and national domain.


